

TOY GROUP - Locker Doors for Albany Rise Primary School

The toy group continues to operate and will be moving toward the first donations for the year within a month or so.

We recently received a certificate of appreciation for job we did for **Albany Rise Primary School** earlier this year. The school had a series of "doorless" locker spaces that are thought to have been in place for more than 20 years. The school purchased some 12mm marine ply and the toy group cut them up into doors a little under 400mm square. A hole for a child to use to open the door was added and a laser-etched animal was added to about half of them. All up, about 90 doors were made.

- New router table is in place with another coming soon. Hand power tools are being retired and sold off and replaced with battery versions soon to be purchased.
- The guest speaker was Frank Duyker who made a great presentation on clocks for woodworkers. Frank discussed the background of horology and explained how to make your own clock. He said there are inexpensive mechanisms available to power the clock face you make as well as many different faces, hands, colours and shapes you can make.

Workshop Operations

<u>Volunteers Lunches</u> – The next lunch will be in recognition of our Duty Members. It is proposed for a weekend day in mid to late July.

<u>New Mobile Router Table</u> – We have finally completed the new unit and it will be added to our workshop in the coming days. Thanks to Trevor Brooks for his work.

The router and lift are identical to the main table router so there is no new induction required on the operation of this one.

The only differences are that it is mobile (with 4 lockable casters), it will live in the Storeroom and be rolled out to be used in the space where the scroll saw resides. The scroll saw would need to be moved (to the store room). The dust extractor outlet will have a quick release attachment to allow for simple changeover.

We appreciate that this is not ideal but we have limited space to place it safely. This machine is mainly for use by the Toy Group as so much of that work now includes router use and as such it will not be set up in a permanent location.



<u>Upgrade of Portable Power Tools</u> – The Committee endorsed replacements and additions to our portable power tools and the following items have been purchased:

- 2 x Makita drills (both with hammer function)
- 1 x Makita Impact driver
- 1 x Makita 125mm Random Orbital Sander
- 1 x Makita 1/3rd sheet finishing sander
- 1 x Makita Jig Saw

All are powered by 18 volt Li-Iron batteries.

The drills, batteries and chargers are located on the wall above the Engineering bench.

The other tools are in their boxes stored in the hand tool shelving units. User manuals are included and should be referred to prior to first time use by members. Batteries are obtained from the charging unit and returned after use – if flat please place on one of the chargers.

We will be selling to members the replaced items which although aged are still suitable for home use.



<u>Volunteer/s to build 2 Possum Nest Boxes</u> – I had a visit from a local resident who has asked us if we could build her 2 possum nest boxes. We would purchase the timber and she would pay and make a donation to the club. If anyone is interested please contact me on 0419696022.

<u>Bags of wood dust / shavings</u> – Our extractor provides us with a continuous supply of these bags that are held on the pallet in the driveway. While we donate some to a local community garden there is always a bag available for member use so feel free to grab some – add to your garden compost or spread as garden paths, etc. We do not want to have to resort to taking to Land Fill. 


