



Looks like we have already lined up an important role for you with Test and Tag of equipment you have offered us an important capability.
- On a wider front our biggest challenges this year will be likely two-fold:

Two projects to improve equipment

- Upgrade to the "Darlec" mobile shop Vacuum to make it easier to move around.
- Build a mobile trolley to hold the Festool dust collector and cyclone device. These have not yet been addressed so hopefully this month!!.

Improving dust collection at the Mitre saw bench

Some work has been done to date to test ideas and this will continue this month – we cannot eliminate dust but act to minimise it during use. Ongoing project.

240 Volt electrical Testing and Tagging

One of our members (and new Committee person) Ian McMaster is qualified for Test & Tag work and has agreed to take on this role for the club. He will review the draft schedule previously developed and confirm it complies with the Standards Requirements for our application prior to undertaking the task.

We are happy to report the sander abrasive has survived recent usage so hopefully members continue to follow the guidelines in conjunction with Duty Member oversight and cleaning.

The scheduled maintenance to rotate the cutters to a "new" sharp edge has been completed. Following on from this we are going to have a machine technician undertake a full review and service. The timing of this will be advertised on the notice board inside the entrance door.

And Thank You to the committee for the gift.







