



Our brand new **eLearning resources** is completed for all our machines (except the lathes). These form the first stage of our new member induction process before presenting for the practical hands-on session and they are also a resource for all existing members on the operation and safety requirements of our machines.

While developing these, each of us involved, learned things about the machines we didn't know before, so we decided that these should be a resource ALL members have access to and can use as a refresher every 2 years. We will supplement these with further videos of advanced techniques and jigs to help everyone get the most out of the machines and create truly intricate projects.

We will set all members up in our Learning Management System where you can access these resources and provide all with the access link to the resources. **Our first refresher will be scheduled to be completed by August** and then every 2 years. The resources remain accessible for us at any time we want to have another look.

The project comprised Norman Bye, Ray Ffrench, Ian Holt and Ian Bell. Our thanks go to them all for the development of these wonderful resources and their commitment to maintain and continually improve these.







